MADISON-Procedures will be changed to prevent the repeat of an incident that led to the accidental death of a monkey used in eye experiments at the University of Wisconsin, an official said.

Jay Noren, vice chancellor of UW Health Sciences, said the incident occurred Oct. 12 at the UW Clinical Sciences Center's animal care unit.

The adult female monkey, which was being used in ophthalmology research, had been put in a holding cage so its regular cage could be steam cleaned.

But the monkey "apparently ran from one of the transport cages into its regular cage, which went into the steam cleaner" without being noticed by the animal caretaker, Noren said.

Noren said the UW will now require two caretakers to examine the cages to make sure the animal is not in the cage scheduled for Milwauker paper cleaning
