
We are writing to inform you that the All Campus Animal Care and Use Committee (AC-ACUC) at the University of Wisconsin-Madison has revoked animal use privileges of one of our investigators, Dr. Ei Terasawa, effective April 1, 2004.

Dr. Terasawa has a grant proposal (NIH grant R01 NS047619, "Embryonic Stem Cell Grafts in Parkinsonian Monkeys") pending with your agency. Research proposed in this grant application will be affected by this action. We are providing this information in fulfillment of our obligation to notify all relevant federal agencies providing support for Dr. Terasawa's research of restriction of animal use privileges.

The committee's action prohibits Dr. Terasawa from directly conducting or supervising research with live animals at the university for a period of two years (April 1, 2004 – March 31, 2006). Dr. Terasawa may apply for reinstatement of animal use privileges after March 31, 2006. She may serve as principal investigator on protocols for the purpose of obtaining tissue on the condition that she or any of the staff she supervises are not directly involved in procurement of the tissues.
